Monday 08/05/2023

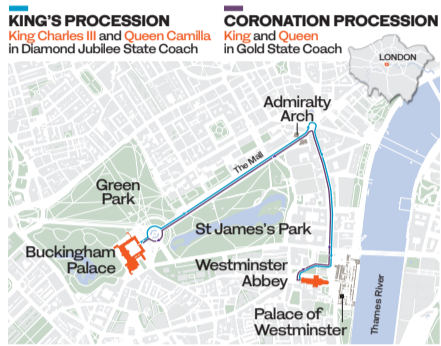
The Big Help Out

ACCESSION TO THE BRITISH THRONE

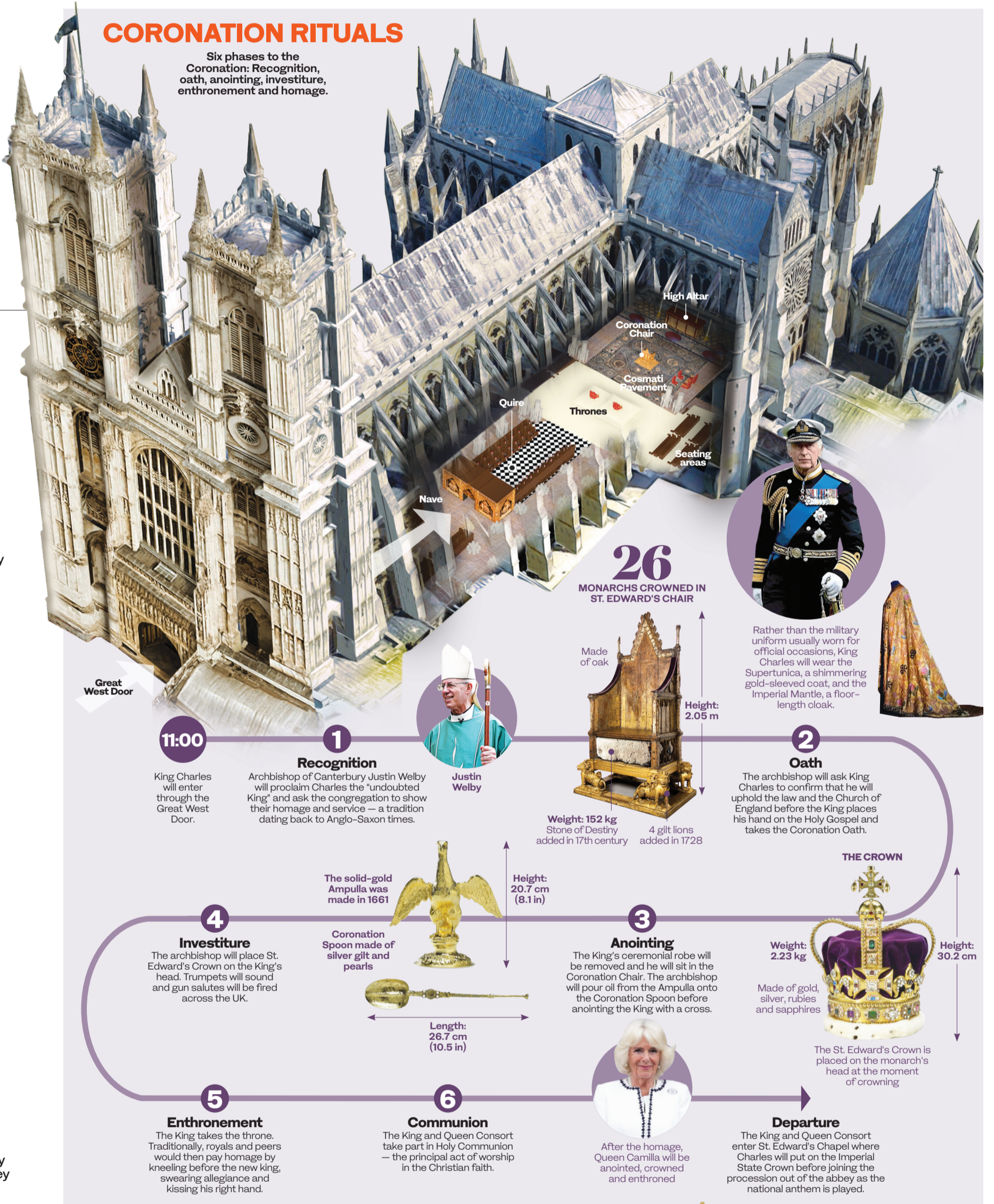
CORONATION PROCESSION ROUTE

Six phases to the Coronation: Recognition, oath, anointing, investiture, enthronement and homage.

Born at Buckingham Palace, to Princess Elizabeth and Philip
- July 1, 1969**
Formally invested as Prince of Wales
- 1970**
Graduates from Cambridge University
- 1971-76**
Serves in the navy
- July 29, 1981**
Marries Lady Diana Spencer
- June 21, 1982**
Birth of Prince William
- Sept. 15, 1984**
Birth of Prince Harry
- Dec. 9, 1992**
Prince and Princess of Wales agree to separate
- Aug. 31, 1997**
Princess Diana killed in a car crash in Paris
- April 9, 2005**
Marries Camilla Parker Bowles in civil ceremony
- May 6, 2023**
Coronation ceremony at Westminster Abbey
